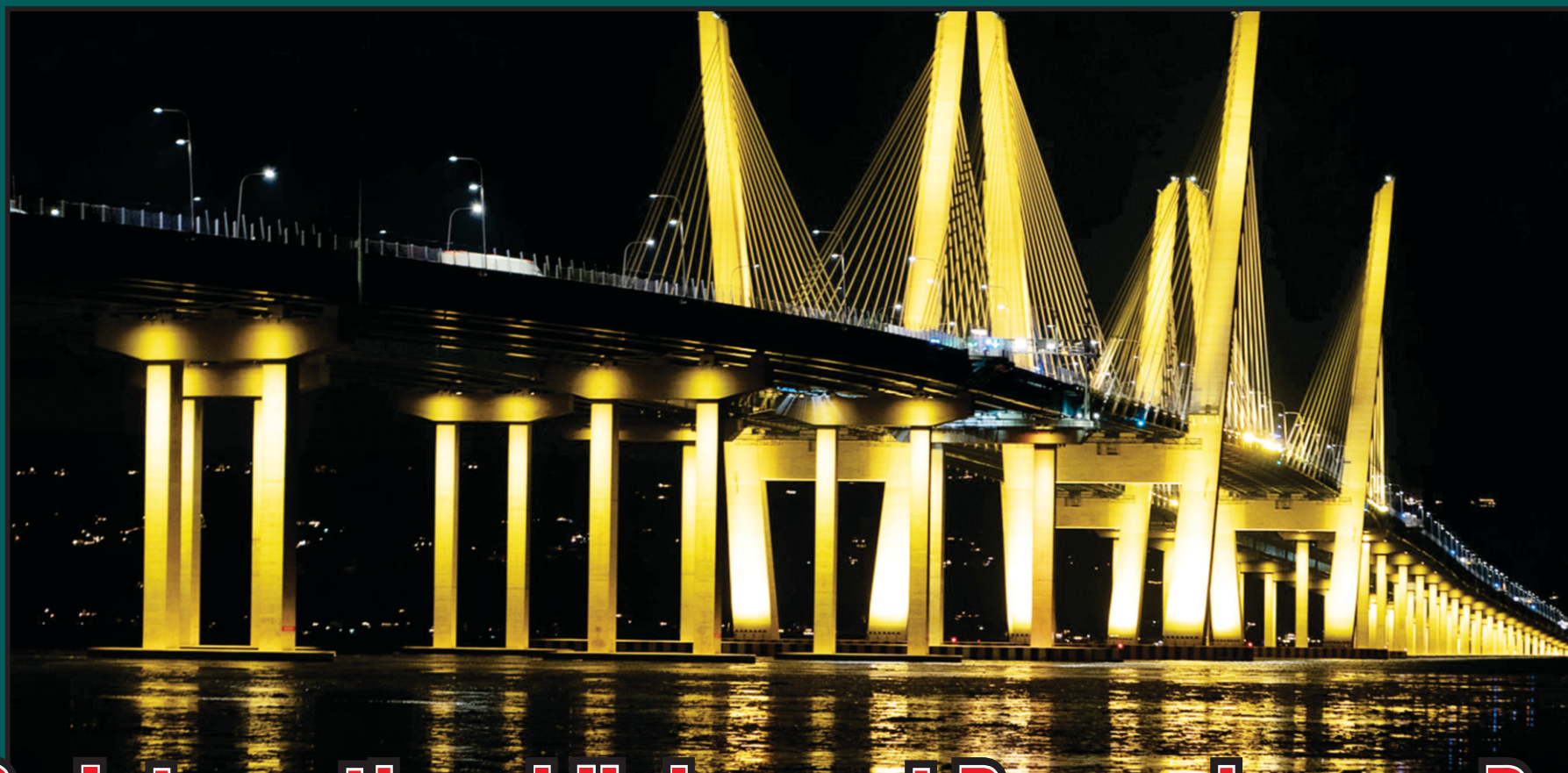

New York Goes Yellow



International Holocaust Remembrance Day was adopted by the United Nations in 2005 and has been held every January 27th since 2006. It is the anniversary of the liberation of the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp. The UN urges every member to honor the 6 million Jewish and 5 million other victims of the Nazis and to develop educational programs to help prevent future genocides.
